- We will be organising a series of smaller workshops and 1- on - 1 meetings with partners and new partners in coming weeks to understand interest in new projects and case studies

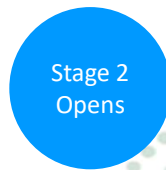

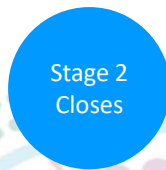
